Through a partnership with CultureWorks, this flexible program teaches academic English, while offering students a Conditional Offer of Admission from its partner institutions upon entry into EAP, thus shortening the gap to undergraduate studies.

1. Grade 11 & 12 (Local) or Grade 10 and 11 (International) students
2. Admission average of 75% or above
3. Complete EAP Entry Exam

2. Upon approval, receive offer package from Amberson (Program information, contract, fee schedule)
3. Pay tuition
4. Complete EAP Entry Exam
5. Individual consultation to choose desired university program
6. The university issues Welcome letter and Conditional Offer of Admission

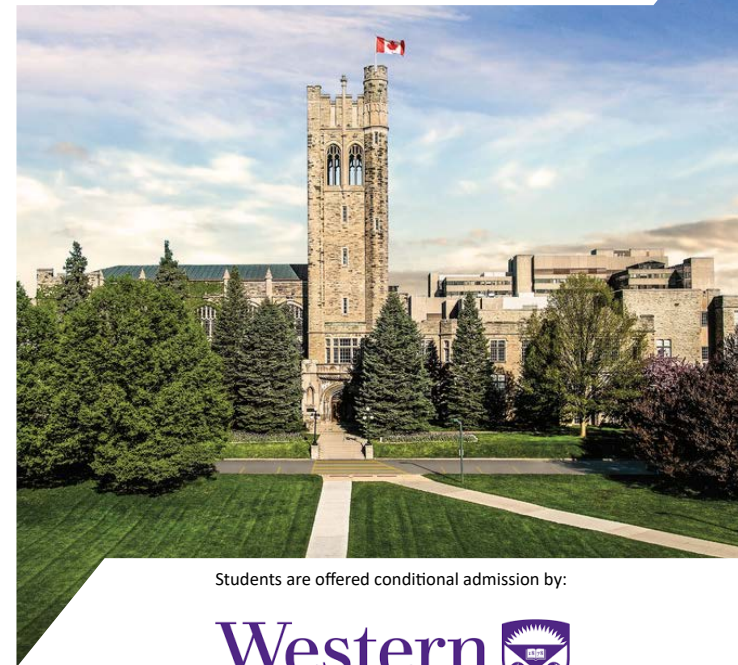
Program Costs
